

Student Forum Scholarship

Purpose: To provide students with financial aid to attend the MSCLS Spring Meeting. The committee selected to judge the applications will determine the number of recipients and award up to three days registration and/or up to two days hotel stay based upon the funds available. The judges will consist of 5 active board members selected by the current Student Forum Chair. The judges will have no direct affiliation with the clinical programs in which the applicants are enrolled.

Eligibility: Students must be a member of MSCLS and either a Junior or Senior in their accredited clinical laboratory science program.

Requirements: The student must fill out the attached application form and have a member of the faculty of their program fill out the recommendation form. Applications must be sent to the current student forum chair. **All applications must be received by March 1st.**

When Awarded: The student will find out by email whether or not they have received an award no less than 2 weeks before the Spring Meeting. The check for reimbursement will be presented at the Student Forum Luncheon held during the Spring Meeting.
